Carisbrook Primary will be celebrating Book Week next week.

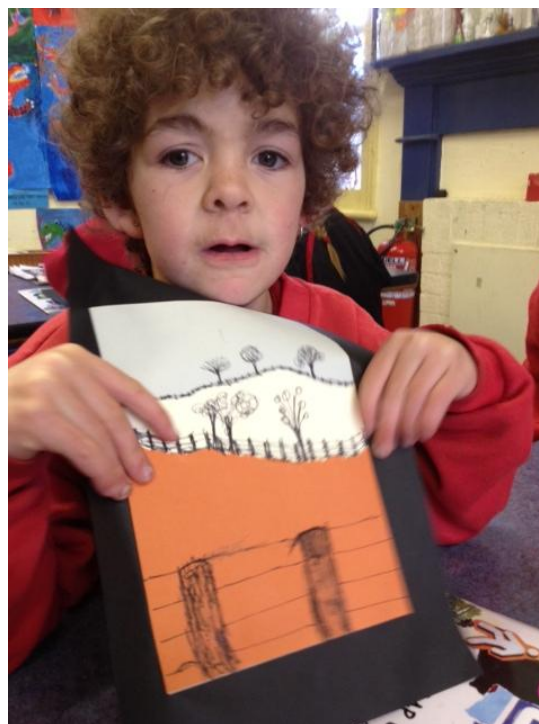
A fancy dress parade has been planned for **Tuesday 20th August at 9am**. Students can dress up as their favourite book character.
